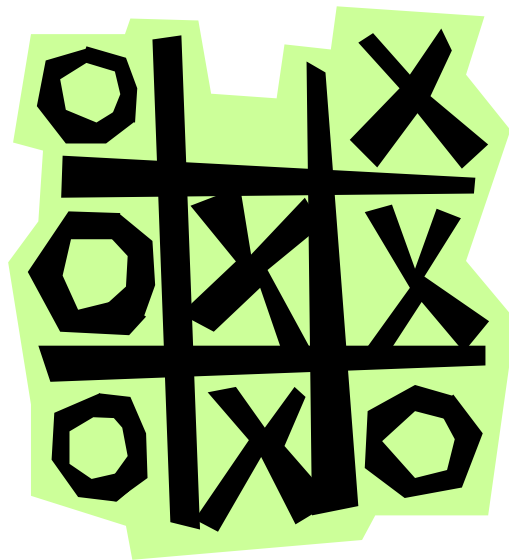

Activity Overview:

This is a game of tic-tac-toe using chairs instead of paper, where students compete by answering 5 different types of Olympic-related questions. The 3 preparation activities provide the factual information and related vocabulary in context so the students will be able to answer the questions.

Activity #1

Mascot Question and Answer Dominoes

Time: 50 minutes

Materials:

- one copy of each Mascot Question and Answer Dominoes sheet (Group A, Sumi, Groups B Miga, Group C Quatchi) **cut into strips**
- one copy of each Mascot Question and Answer Dominoes sheet (Group A, Sumi, Groups B Miga, Group C Quatchi) **not cut into strips** (this is for the teacher)

Learning Outcomes:

- acquire basic knowledge of the 2010 Winter Olympic Mascots

Suggested Approach:

1. teacher writes 'Mascot' on the board and discusses the meaning with the class (elicit examples)
2. show pictures of the 3 2010 Winter Olympic/Paralympic Mascots (Sumi, Miga and Quatchi)
3. teacher encourages students to ask questions, students share what they know about the 3 mascots in pairs
4. model the activity using Group A Sumi strips
5. hand out one strip each to eight students (the teacher can write the names of the students and the number of the strip given on their intact copy)
6. the student that has 'Start' on their strip starts the sequence by reading the question, 'Who is Sumi?' (this student **must** call out '#1')
7. the student that has the strip with #1 on it replies, and continues the sequence by asking the next question (each student **must** call out the number after the question)
8. to be able to answer the questions, the students have to listen closely to the questions
9. once the students have a good idea how to do the activity, divide the class into 3 groups and give each group a set of strips (the lower level students should be in group A, as it has already been modelled)
10. after the 3 groups have finished, regroup the students into 3's (one from group A, one from group B, one from group C)
11. students share what they learned about the mascots, then complete the Jigsaw worksheet together

Activity #2

Time: 40 minutes

Materials:

- one copy of Partner A, B, C and D Worksheet for ½ the class

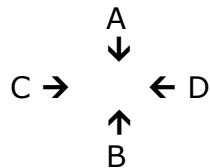
Learning Outcomes:

- acquire factual information and vocabulary about the 2010 Winter Olympics/Paralympics
- listening and pronunciation
- asking for clarification and spelling

Suggested Approach:

Variation 1 (*Concentration Activity*)

1. Students sit in groups of 4 (partners A, B, C and D)
2. Partner A faces partner B, and Partner C faces Partner D, as shown below:



3. Each student has their corresponding worksheet (example: Partner A has Partner A Worksheet)
4. Pairs dictate and fill in the information simultaneously, this requires concentration as this is a crossfire conversation
5. Upon completion, Partners A and B check their worksheets together, and C and D do the same
6. Pairs can either switch roles or share what they learned

Variation 2 (*Basic Pair Information Gap Activity*)

1. Students work in pairs, half the class complete Worksheets A and B, the other half complete Worksheets C and D
2. Pairs check their answers together
3. Pairs can either switch roles or share what they learned

Activity #3

Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle

Time: 30 minutes

Materials:

- one copy of the Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle for each student
- for variations 2 and 3, one copy of the clues to the Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle cut up

Learning Outcomes:

- review and practise Olympic-related vocabulary

Suggested Approach:

Variation 1 (Simple Pair Crossword Activity)

- 1) Students work in pairs to complete the Crossword Puzzle
- 2) Pairs check and discuss with another pair
- 3) Take up and discuss as a whole class

Variation 2 (Pair Dictation Crossword Activity)

- 1) Cut up the clues to the Crossword and hang them on the wall around the room
- 2) Students work in pairs, one student sits down and has the crossword puzzle grid, the other one walks around reading the clues and relays them to their partner
- 3) Once the pair has completed half the puzzle, students switch roles

Variation 3 (Mingle Crossword Activity)

- 1) Cut up the clues to the Crossword and hand one or two clues out to each student
- 2) Hand out one copy of the Vocabulary Crossword Puzzle to each student
- 3) Students complete the puzzle by walking around sharing their clues with each other

Activity #4

3D Tic-Tac-Toe

Time: 45 minutes

Materials:

- 9 chairs set up in a tic-tac-toe grid (3 across and 3 down)
- labels (nametags or coloured paper) marked with X or O
- one overhead transparency (cut up) of each of the 5 different worksheets (True or False, Fill-in the Blank, Multiple Choice, Guess the Word, and Answer the Question)

Learning Outcomes:

- review Olympic Facts and Vocabulary in a competitive format

Suggested Approach:

- 1) Divide the students into 2 teams, one team with X labels on their chests, the other team with O labels on their chests
- 2) The X team lines up on one side of the room, and the O team lines up on the other side of the room
- 3) Shuffle all the cut up overhead transparencies together
- 4) The teacher displays one of the overhead transparencies on the overhead
- 5) One member of each team runs to the board and writes the answer on the board
- 6) The student who writes the correct answer first sits down on one of the chairs in the tic-tac-toe chair grid
- 7) The teacher then displays the next transparency, and the next 2 team members (one from X team and one from O team) come up and try to answer
- 8) The game continues like this until X or O team has 3 members sitting in a row in the chair grid (either vertical, horizontal and diagonal), giving that team 1 point
- 9) You can play until all the questions have been used, or set a time limit

Option: The questions can also be used in a Jeopardy type game in which each type of question is worth a different number of points. Example: True/False = 100 points, fill-in-the-blank = 200, etc.

Extension Activities

Suggested Activities:

- ❖ Have the students work in groups of 4 or 5, give them copies of all the questions (cut up and shuffled), students take turns asking and answering the questions
- ❖ Divide the class into 4 groups, give each group a sheet of flip chart paper, groups write sentences with information they recall from the tic-tac-toe game, the team with the most sentences wins
- ❖ Walk and Swap ~ cut up the questions from the tic-tac-toe activity and give one to each student, students walk around, ask their question, answer then swap the question cards

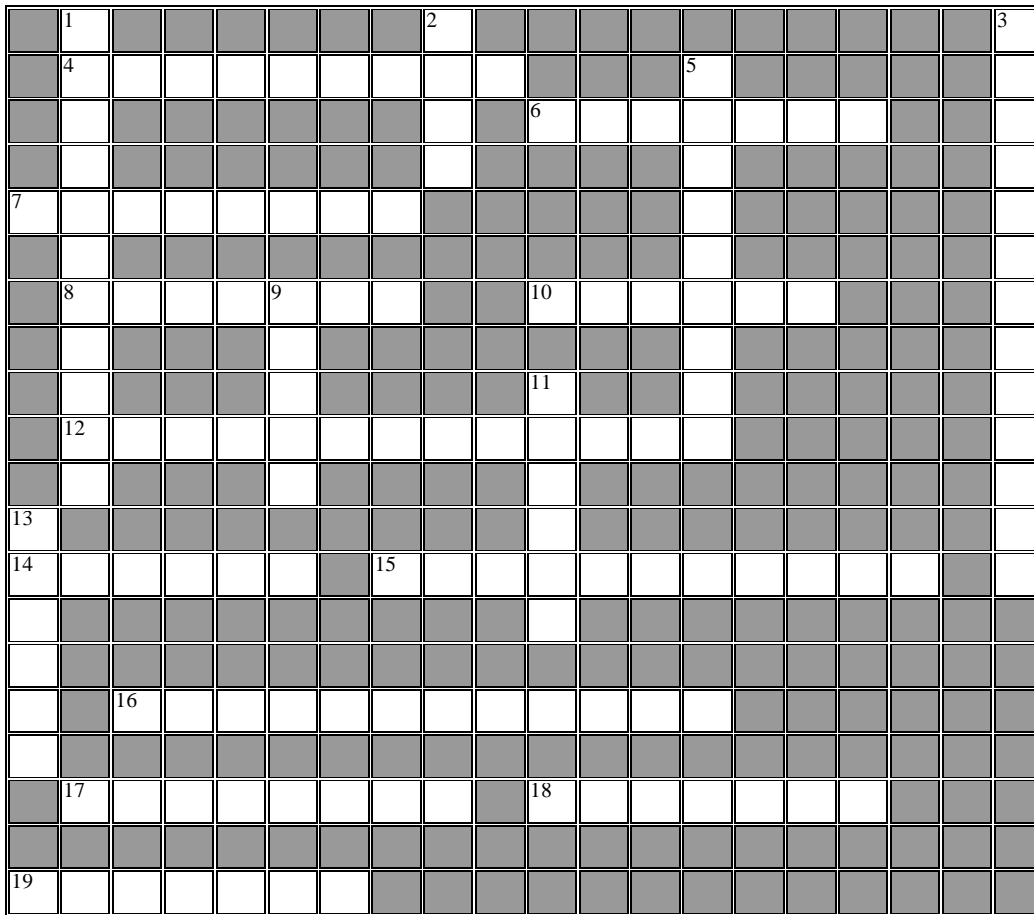
