

English Language Services for Adults (ELSA)

Intermediate Level
Classes:

Regular ELSA 4/5

and

**ELSA for the
Workplace 4/5**

Regular ELSA
Levels 4 and 5

**Do you want to improve your
English and learn about
Canadian society and your
community?**

This class is designed for you.
You can join an ELSA level 4 or
level 5 class at the beginning of
most months, as soon as there is
a space available in the class.

Classes are available full-time,
part-time, and evenings.
Childcare is available at some
ELSA schools.

You will learn things that all
newcomers need to know to start
a new life in Canada.

Topics may include: housing,
banking, education, employment,
citizenship, health, transportation,
immigration, and Canadian
political and legal systems. Your
class will take fieldtrips in your
community and sometimes listen
to guest speakers.

To be eligible you must:

Be a current or recent ELSA level
3 graduate; OR be a new client
assessed at ELSA level 4 or 5.

Be able to attend classes
regularly. You may apply for
holiday leave of up to two weeks
during your program.

One program transfer is allowed
between the ELSA for the
Workplace and the Regular ELSA
programs.

**ELSA for the Workplace
Levels 4 and 5**

**Do you want to improve your
English, and get a job soon?**

This program is designed for you.
It includes three parts: labour
market focused English classes,
computer classes, and fieldtrips
and guest speakers. Classes are
available full-time, part-time, and
evenings.

English Classes

You will learn English skills for working in Canada. Some of the topics covered include Canadian workplace culture, workplace communication, telephone skills, job search skills, goal setting, and computer training. You will get ready to work in Canada, and understand the Canadian labour market.

Computer Training

You will learn computer skills that you can use at work in Canada, and when looking for a job. These include computer programs such as MS Word and Excel, using the Internet, and finding job-related websites.

Fieldtrips and Guest Speakers

You will take fieldtrips around your community related to job training and your job search. Guest speakers will talk to your class about work-related issues in Canada.

To be eligible you must:

Plan to start a job training or another language training program, OR start working, looking for work or a better job, after finishing the ELSA for the Workplace program.

Be a current or recent ELSA level 3 graduate; OR be a new client assessed at ELSA level 4 or 5.

One program transfer is allowed between the ELSA for the Workplace and the Regular ELSA program.
